
ARGUMENTATIVE WRITING writing a claim



Claim: A statement that can be argued. Evidence can be used to prove (or disprove) the argument. The <u>claim</u> in an argumentative essay is the <u>thesis</u> of the essay.

Discussion and Practice:

What do you think? Look at the topic and think of a "pro" claim and a "con" argument.





A claim is your thesis. It is a strong statement that shows your belief and it is what you will argue in your essay.

Examples about school uniforms:

Pro: School uniforms improve the overall academic life at schools.

<u>Con:</u> School uniforms limit the growth and independence of students in schools.


Examples about cell phones for elementary students:

Pro: Cell phones are an important tool that elementary students should own.

Con: Cell phones are a distraction that do not benefit elementary students.
