Students desire to hear three things from their teacher:

1. I believe in you.2. You have a purpose.3. How are you?

"Positive framing means making interventions to correct student behavior in a positive and constructive way. It does not mean avoiding interventions so you can talk instead only about the positive behavior you see. It is teaching kids in an optimistic, upbeat, confident manner."- Doug Lemov
