

CLASSROOM ROUTINES: *with vocabulary*

"BELL-RINGERS" "MORNING WORK" "WARM-UPS" "JOURNAL TIME"

The first 5-10 minutes of every class.

- ► Give students a task or question
- Independent work
- works great with free-writing practice, too

Management:

- ► Keep in a notebook
- ► don't need to mark
- ► mark one a week
- > quick review as a class / partners



"TICKET-OUT-THE-DOOR" "EXIT-WORK"

- Like a "bell-ringer" but at the end of a lesson
- Ask one essential question from the lesson as a quick assessment
- > assign one task to complete before leaving



M, T, W, TH, F ROUTINE

> Assign a task form M-F, and keep it the same every week:

Monday: Write a sentence Tuesday: Draw a picture Wednesday: Act it out / make a gesture Thursday: Write a list of synonyms Friday: Write a silly story



Everyday choose one box from vocabulary "Bingo", but must be different every day.

SILENT READING + TASK

Reading is never a solitary task. Always give them a task:

- Write-down & look up new words
- Vocabulary Bingo / Choice board
- ► Write a prediction
- ► "This reminds me of…"



DONE EARLY?

No such thing as:

- ► waiting
- ► being bored
- ► doing nothing

Give a task:

Vocabulary & Spelling Bingo is great for this



VOCABULARY - SPELLING BINGO

How can I use this?

- ► Bell-Ringers/Exit-slips
- ► After reading
- When students finish work early
- Roll a dice: assign each box to a number
- ► M-F do a different box
- "Quilt" each student has to complete the entire grid, one at a time, as their own choice



MANAGEMENT:

1. notebooks







3. weekly pages

4. Grading options:

- Grade once a week; students don't know which
- Stamp or check each one in class
- Class assessment: ask for answers and ideas after completion
- Use these activities as an assessment for you as the teacher, not necessarily as a grade for students
